
To help you with property maintenance, we are here to answer your questions and assist you. This calendar outlines your responsibilities, but also directs you to available City resources.

Dearborn Recreation offers more than 40 public parks, eight outdoor pools, Robert Herndon's Dearborn Hills Golf Course, the Dearborn Ice Skating Center (DISC), Camp Dearborn and the magnificent Ford Community & Performing Arts Center.

The Center is a multi-faceted, multi-facility network of leisure, fitness, life enrichment and cultural arts activities, offering something for everyone.

It is filled with athletic equipment, a double gymnasium, two pools, a climbing wall, a walking track, free weights, and exercise rooms to accommodate fitness and dance classes.

Monthly passholder rates for Dearborn residents are as low as \$19.75 for Youths (ages 4-17), \$33 for Individuals (ages 18-59), \$26 for Seniors and \$56 for Families. Restrictions apply. Call 943-2350 for further information.

The Center also includes a comprehensive Senior Citizens Center with classrooms and a lounge, an impressive art gallery, and the incredible Michael A. Guido Theater, a better-than-Broadway theater with more than 1,200 seats.

# CITY BUDGET

The City of Dearborn's consolidated budget is \$205,220,520, including federal and state grants for community improvements, operation of six senior citizen apartment buildings, state-shared taxes for highway repair and resurfacing, and water-sewer fees collected and paid to the City of Detroit. The sources of that money and the services and programs they pay for are explained below.



## Your City Tax Dollars at Work

The City of Dearborn uses property tax dollars to provide high quality and comprehensive services to residents and businesses. Those City services are offered using just 32.5 cents of every dollar the City collects in property taxes. That means that 67.5 cents of every dollar the City collects in property taxes goes to other public agencies, like Wayne County and the public schools. Although the City is the collecting agent, it has no authority over how the 67.5 cents is used by other public agencies.

## POLICE & FIRE DEPARTMENTS

Dearborn has outstanding Police and Fire Departments. Mandatory staffing levels, and continuous investment in effective technology and relevant training, reflect the City's commitment to excellent public safety services.

The Fire Department has a "Best in Class" response time of under 4 minutes and all apparatus are equipped with medical response technologies. All firefighters train for Advanced Life Support certification.

The Dearborn Police Department also boasts impressive response times and actively reaches out to the public to work together to keep the community safe.

## NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

To report crimes in progress or other emergency situations, call 911.

- The Suspicious Activity Tip Line is 943-3030. Calls are anonymous.
- The Neighborhood Watch Program enlists the active participation of citizens in cooperation with the Police Department to reduce crime, create alert neighborhoods, and encourage the reporting of suspicious activity.
- For general information regarding the Police Department, call 943-2240.
- To file a non-emergency online report, log on to [www.cityofdearborn.org](http://www.cityofdearborn.org) and follow the directions in the Public Safety section.

## PREPARING FOR EMERGENCIES

- Be prepared to take care of household needs without outside help for a minimum of three days. Create a disaster supply kit.
- Responsible family members should know where, when and how to shut off the electricity, gas and water supply. Have a fire extinguisher and make sure every family member knows where it is and how to use it.
- For more information, visit [www.fema.gov](http://www.fema.gov) or [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov).
- The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program helps people be better prepared for emergency situations in their communities. To join the CERT team, call 943-5470.

## FIRE SAFETY

- Install smoke detectors on every level of your home and outside of each bedroom. When you change your clocks, change your smoke detector batteries.
- Establish and practice fire escape drills.
- Never go back in a burning building once you have exited. Go to a safe meeting place.
- Never use gasoline as a cleaning agent.
- Clean lint from dryer vents each time you use it. Every year in Dearborn several houses burn when dryer lint catches on fire. Don't leave your dryer running when you are not home.
- Never leave food cooking on a stove unattended. It is the leading cause of fires.
- Never use charcoal grills indoors, inside a garage or on a balcony. Never store hot coals or a hot grill in your home or garage.

## WEATHER EMERGENCIES

- Stay indoors and away from windows and doors during a thunderstorm, and stay off the phone.
- Stay away from downed power lines. If power lines are down, keep children and pets indoors. Don't touch a metal fence in the area of a downed power line.
- Never try to drive or walk through water in the roadway.



## PUBLIC SAFETY POLICIES

### FIREWORKS

- The City maintains a zero tolerance policy regarding the illegal and unsafe use of personal fireworks. To report fireworks use, call 943-2201.
- Adults violating the City's fireworks ordinances will be ticketed. Parents whose children violate the fireworks ordinance may be ticketed under the parental responsibility ordinance.
- If a fireworks makes a loud bang, leaves the ground, spins or twirls, it is illegal.
- For more information, call the Fire Marshall at 943-2838.

## CELL PHONES AND OTHER DRIVING DISTRACTIONS

- Drivers stopped for a traffic violation in Dearborn face an additional \$100 ticket if they are observed using a hand-held cell phone when committing the violation.
- The ordinance does not apply to drivers using phone headsets or other hands-free devices.

## PLAYING GAMES IN THE STREET

- Using portable basketball hoops, hockey goals and other recreational equipment on public streets and easements is illegal. They may be removed, without notice to the owner, and impounded. The fine for a first time offense is \$100; after that the charge is a misdemeanor. Offenders must also pay impound fees.

## RECREATIONAL FIRE PITS

- Standing fire pits with a surrounding screening and a top cover are allowed in Dearborn provided the fire is constantly attended.
- If there is objectionable smoke, or if the wind direction causes the smoke to invade neighboring structures, the fire must be put out.
- Fire extinguishing mediums must be provided. These can include an appropriate fire extinguisher, a garden hose, dirt or sand.
- Approved fire pits must be more than 15 feet away from a structure.
- Wood must be clean. You must not burn construction materials or trash.
- Residents are not allowed to have a fire in an open metal can or barrel.

## SAFE INTERSECTIONS

- Do not park within 20 feet of a crossing area or within 30 feet of a traffic control device, to keep intersections clear so children and pedestrians are not hidden from approaching vehicles.
- You could be ticketed if you park too close.

## MOPEDS AND POCKET BIKES

- If a vehicle is not or cannot be registered with the Michigan Secretary of State's Office, it may not be operated on a public street or sidewalk in Dearborn. Violators may be cited and the vehicle may be impounded.



# PUBLIC SERVICE DAYS

## NEW GUIDELINES FOR 2010

**Keep parked vehicles off the streets  
8 a.m. to 4 p.m. every trash day April-November**

### What has changed in 2010?

Public Service Days now will occur on every trash day in your neighborhood during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November.

On your trash day during those months, you must keep your parked vehicles off your neighborhood streets from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. This is a later start than under previous rules, to make it more convenient for residents. In many cases, residents have already left for work or school by 8 a.m.

### What does the City do on Public Service Days?

Public Service Days allow the City to provide services like street sweeping, tree trimming, sewer maintenance and loose leaf collection in a more effective manner.

### What are my responsibilities on Public Service Days?

You must keep your parked vehicles off the street from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on your neighborhood's Public Service Days.

You could be ticketed if you park on the street during Public Service Days in your neighborhood. Your vehicle may also be subjected to towing.

You also must keep your trash cans, yard waste containers and recyclable containers off the street. They should be placed on the easement for collection.

In addition, it is your responsibility not to park on the street in other City neighborhoods during their Public Service Days.



## LOOSE LEAF COLLECTION

Loose leaf collection is scheduled to begin October 18, 2010 and end December 3, 2010. Weather conditions can alter this schedule.

Loose leaves will be picked up in your neighborhood on your Trash Day/Public Service Days each week. Check the map on this page to determine what your Trash Day/Public Service Day is.

Residents are asked to rake their leaves into the street as close to their neighborhood's Trash Day/Public Service Days as possible.

Remember, you must keep your parked vehicles off the street on your Trash Day/Public Service Days.

You can also dispose of leaves with paper yard waste bags or in 20-32 gallon containers with yard waste stickers. These can be put out on the curb on your trash pickup day every week. Leaves in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be picked up.

## SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

### Move Parked Vehicles When Plows Are Out



Snow plowing is more effective and is safer when parked vehicles are off the roads. So you *should* remove your parked vehicles each time a heavy snowfall is predicted.

If the City declares a snow emergency, then you **MUST** remove your parked vehicles from the street or you could be ticketed and your vehicles could be towed. Police do not issue warnings.

In general, a snow emergency will be declared when it is predicted that snowfall will exceed 3 inches or more over a short period.

When a snow emergency is declared, the City contacts TV and radio stations.

Snow emergencies are also posted on the City's website, [www.cityofdearborn.org](http://www.cityofdearborn.org) and on CDTV, which is

cable channel 12 on Comcast and cable channel 10 on WOW. (CDTV is not carried on AT&T cable.)

You may also hear the City's emergency warning sirens when a snow emergency is declared.

When snow plowing is needed, City ordinance allows vehicles in a driveway to be parked across the sidewalk without penalty.

# RULES FOR TRASH, RECYCLING & YARD WASTE

## TRASH PICKUP AND STORAGE RULES

- Trash containers must be set out on the easement, **NOT** in the street, after 5 p.m. the night before collection day or by 7 a.m. on trash collection day.
- All containers must be removed from the curb by midnight at the end of your trash day and stored in your garage or behind the house. You could receive a ticket if your containers are not stored properly.
- All loose trash must be bagged and placed in a can or tied up in bundles when set out at the curb. Do not put out anything that can blow around.
- Only 32 gallon cans or sturdy heavy mil plastic bags (35 pounds maximum weight) are allowed at the curb for pick up.
- Larger, rat proof containers with lids can be used for storage of trash. Do not store loose trash or trash bags on the ground. Trash cans and recycle bins must be stored in your garage or behind your house.
- Failure to comply with these instructions may result in fines and a court ticket. For more information, call 943-2085.

## ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS FOR CURBSIDE PICKUP

- Trash bags. Must be tied. 35 pounds each.
- Trash cans. 32 gallon, 35 pounds each. Bags inside must be tied.
- Construction material. Must be bagged or bundled and weigh 35 pounds or less. Limit 5 a week or 20 a year.
- Household furniture. Large move-outs do not qualify.
- Household appliances. Doors must be off refrigerators and freezers.
- Carpet/padding. Tied in 4 foot rolls. No more than 35 pounds each. Limit 6 rooms a year.
- Windows. Up to 4 x 6 feet. Limit 5 a week or 20 a year.
- Garage doors. Up to 8 x 8 feet.
- Animal droppings. Must be placed in doubled plastic bags.
- Latex paint. Can must be completely dried out.

**EXCEPTIONS:** Special pickup charges of a minimum of \$50 will be applied to the following:

- Large move-outs.
- Excessive construction materials. Private contractors are responsible for hauling away their own debris. Roll off Dumpsters may be required, at the homeowner's expense.
- Improperly bundled trash, yard waste and construction material.
- Dirt, sod, sand, concrete and bricks.
- Firewood, logs, stumps.
- Bathtubs, sinks, laundry tubs, toilets.
- Any automotive parts.
- Tires are **NOT** accepted at the curb for disposal.

## DISPOSAL AT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS YARD

2951 Greenfield

The DPW Yard is open 8 a.m.-1 p.m. the third Saturday of each month for disposal of items not picked up at the curb.

Items accepted at the DPW yard are: furniture and other non-hazardous household materials from large move-outs; dirt, sod, sand, concrete and bricks; firewood, logs and stumps; bathtubs, laundry tubs, sinks and toilets.

A partial list of materials not accepted at the DPW yard are: fuel, tires, ammunition or refrigerators, microwaves or other appliances.

Remember, hazardous materials are not acceptable for either curbside disposal or for disposal at the DPW Yard. To check if your materials are acceptable for disposal, call DPW at 943-2085.



## CURBSIDE YARD WASTE/BRUSH DISPOSAL

The curbside yard waste recycling program will run from April through November.

- Yard waste is grass clippings, weeds, leaves, shrub and brush trimmings. Remove dirt from roots. Do not mix fruits, vegetables or animal droppings with your yard waste.
- Dirt and sod are not acceptable as yard waste.
- Do not use plastic bags or cardboard boxes for yard waste.
- Brush must be less than 3 inches in diameter. It must be 4 feet long or less, tied with heavy cord or rope, and weigh no more than 35 pounds. It must be bundled. Remove root balls from shrubs and bundle same as brush.
- Yard waste may be placed loose in your own 20-32 gallon containers with a yard waste sticker on the lid. You may use yard waste paper bags, which are available at most major home improvement stores.
- Unbundled or improperly bundled brush requires a special pickup. For more information, call 943-2085.

## MANDATORY RECYCLING

**New:** DPW now accepts plastic containers with the numbers 1-7 on bottom. Discard lids in your regular trash.

The following clean items can also be placed in the City-issued orange or green recycling bins:

- Cardboard boxes that are cut to fit inside the bin, cereal boxes and pop can cases. No pizza boxes.
- Glass bottles/jars. Only clear, brown and green are accepted. Discard lids in your regular trash.
- Office paper. Bundle with string or place in paper bag to prevent from scattering.
- Household batteries placed in small clear plastic bag. No automotive batteries.
- Newspapers and all ads. Bundle with string or place in paper bag.
- Phone books/magazines/catalogs. These must be bundled with string.
- Aluminum and tin cans.
- Plastic grocery bags.
- Empty aerosol cans. Discard lids in your regular trash.
- Shredded paper.
- Pre-packaged plastic food containers.

Do **NOT** recycle the following at the curb: light bulbs, plate or drinking glasses, anti-freeze or oil containers, Styrofoam and foam, and lighter fluid containers. If an item is left in your bin, it is probably because it is not recyclable. For more information or a new bin, call 943-2085.

## HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

The City of Dearborn has not scheduled a Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off Day in 2010. However, the Wayne County Department of Environment will be hosting several drop off days. For information, call (734) 326-3936.

Never set hazardous material at the curb. This includes car batteries, oil-based paint, turpentine, antifreeze, gasoline, chemicals, pesticides, transmission fluid, poisons, asbestos, shellac, and used motor oil. For additional information about hazardous waste, call DPW at 943-2085.

## TRASH HOLIDAYS IN 2010

After the following 2010 holidays, trash pickup will be delayed one day for the remainder of the week: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day and Thanksgiving Day.

## DID YOU KNOW?

Recycling is the right thing to do, and the City was a leader with its curbside recycling program. But sometimes the low market value of recyclable materials and the price for processing certain materials can mean that it costs more money than it would to dispose of these same products in a landfill. For instance, in November 2009, it cost the City \$22 a ton to pick up trash from the curbside and take it to a landfill, and \$67 a ton to pick up recyclable material from the curbside and have it processed. Increasing the demand for recyclable products in the consumer market could raise the value of recyclable materials, and maybe lower the cost for curbside pick up.

# PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

## PEST CONTROL (943-2099)

To prevent rodents and other pests from living on or visiting your property, take the following steps.

- Seal garbage in tightly covered containers.
- Remove animal feces from your yard every day.
- Do not leave uneaten pet food outside. Do not put bird food on the ground.
- Pick up fruit that falls from your trees daily, and pick ripe vegetables immediately.
- Keep all materials that are permitted to be stored outside, such as firewood, a minimum 12 inches off of the ground.
- Do not set out rat poison. Poison is dangerous to children and pets.
- Call the City for help at 943-2099. (All calls are kept confidential.)

## ABANDONED VEHICLES (943-2259)

The Dearborn Police Department will tow and dispose of unwanted vehicles year round for free. Call 943-2259 to arrange for a removal date for your vehicle, or to report an abandoned vehicle.

## GRAFFITI ABATEMENT (943-2241)

A \$100 reward will be paid to anyone who provides information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person spraying graffiti or committing other acts of vandalism. Call Dearborn Police at 943-2241.



## RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

The Residential Services Department is focused on protecting property values through the enforcement of residential building codes and minimum housing standards.

- Non-Owner Occupied (Rental) Homes
  - All non-owner occupied dwellings must be registered. Property owners may be ticketed and fined for failing to register rental properties.
  - All non-owner occupied dwellings are inspected every three years so that Certificates of Occupancy are kept current.
  - You can look up registered rental properties at [www.cityofdearborn.org](http://www.cityofdearborn.org) “Useful Links.” If you suspect that there is an illegal rental property in your neighborhood, call 943-2161.
- Vacant Homes
  - Homes vacant for more than 90 days must be registered.
  - Exterior property maintenance inspections are performed at registered vacant homes on a regular basis.

- You can look up registered vacant properties at [www.cityofdearborn.org](http://www.cityofdearborn.org) “Useful Links.” If you suspect that there is an unregistered vacant home in your neighborhood, call 943-2161.
- Homes for Sale
  - It is unlawful for any person to occupy or reoccupy a dwelling until a Certificate of Occupancy has been issued.
  - Inspections must be made when homes are for sale.
  - To schedule an inspection, call 943-2120.
- Permits
  - Permits are required for many home improvement projects and must be obtained before starting work. To verify that a permit is required for your project, call 943-2154.
  - Projects are reviewed and inspected to ensure work is being performed properly and according to all applicable building and safety codes.
  - It takes 5-10 working days for the application review process to be completed.
  - You could be subject to penalty fees for failing to obtain a permit. You may also be required to dismantle and remove completed work.
  - Visit [www.cityofdearborn.org](http://www.cityofdearborn.org) or the Residential Services Department at 4500 Maple for permit applications and permit information.
- Homeowner Permit vs. Contractor Permit
  - Homeowners are cautioned not to obtain a permit on behalf of a contractor.
  - Contractors may be attempting to absolve themselves from liability and poor workmanship.
  - It is not cheaper for a homeowner to obtain a permit.

## TREE PROGRAMS

- Dearborn strongly encourages the preservation of trees and the planting of new trees on residential property for a healthy environment and appealing neighborhoods.
- Homeowners can participate in a low-cost tree-planting program to beautify the easements in front of their houses. Call DPW at 943-2317 in February 2010 for more details.
- Homeowners may need a permit to remove a tree on their property and may be required to replace or relocate the tree. For details, and advice about tree-trimming and tree maintenance, call 943-2317.



## NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATIONS

Neighborhood associations bring residents together to assist with the conservation of existing neighborhoods. For information, call 943-2216.

## NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES (943-2161)

All residents have an obligation to their neighbors. Keeping Dearborn clean and safe is everybody's responsibility. To that end, Dearborn property owners and residents must maintain their houses and yards to comply with safety and appearance standards.

The Neighborhood Services Division of the Department of Public Works is responsible for the appearance of our neighborhoods by managing nuisances.

If you have a concern about the condition of a property in your neighborhood, call Neighborhood Services at 943-2161. The identity of callers remains confidential.

Notices of Violation will be issued for failure to maintain property.

### Common property maintenance to perform:

- Scrape and paint homes and garages.
- Repair detached gutters, siding and roofing.
- Repair minor porch and step defects.
- Replace or repair missing or broken doors and windows.

### Outside storage guidelines

It is unlawful to store items outside, such as, but not limited to:

- Inoperable vehicles and parts.
- Building materials, unless the materials are to be used for a project whereby a valid permit exists.
- Interior furniture, appliances, garden tools and lawn equipment.
- Trash of any kind, other than household trash stored according to City ordinances.

**City ordinance requires that property owners keep their grass a height of 6 inches or less.**

All areas of the property must be maintained, including adjoining sidewalks, easements, public right-of-ways, alleys, fence lines, rear property lines, parking areas and perimeters of buildings.

Property owners must also keep their yards and flower beds free of weeds, overgrown vegetation, litter and debris.

If violations are not corrected by the owner or occupant within the time specified on the notice, the City may perform the work and assess all cutting and/or cleanup costs, plus an administrative fee, to the property owner.

Continued failure to maintain your property may result in tickets and court action.
