# City BUDGET

The City of Dearborn's consolidated budget is \$191,902,285, including federal and state grants for community improvements, operation of six senior citizen apartment buildings, state-shared taxes for highway repair and resurfacing, and water-sewer fees collected and paid to the City of Detroit. The sources of that money and the services and programs they pay for are explained below.

## City Services: 35 cents of your tax dollar

The City of Dearborn uses property tax dollars to provide high quality and comprehensive services to residents and businesses. Those City services are offered using just 35 cents of every dollar the City collects in property taxes. That means that 65 cents of every dollar the City collects in property taxes goes to other public agencies, like Wayne County and the public schools. Although the City is the collecting agent, it has no authority over how the 65 cents is used by other public agencies.




Settled in 1786, Dearborn began to grow in earnest after the opening of the Erie Canal in 1825. The canal provided settlers with a water route, taking them from New York across Lake Erie to Detroit. The steamer ship, "The Michigan," was one of the boats that regularly made the arduous passage to the "old" Northwest Territory. Settlers had to travel through difficult conditions to reach their land claims and begin to build their homesteads. Shown here is the illustration from the cover of William Nowlin's memoir *The Bark Covered House*, which is the story of his family's experience.

Originally known as the Sauk Trail, construction began on the Chicago Road, now known as Michigan Avenue, (upper right) in 1825. The area was characterized by dense woodlands, marshes and swamps, and the primitive roads inspired descriptions like *"one continuous mud hole."* Transportation was so difficult that inns and taverns were life-savers for weary travelers. The Ten Eyck Tavern became a well-known landmark along the route. At different times, other anticipated stops were the Schaefer Family's Six Mile House (above), Thompson's Tavern, Papke 10-Mile House and the Dearborn Hotel (right).

Natural resources propelled Dearborn's earliest industries. During the 19th Century, brick manufacturers like Dort, Haggerty, Clippert, Wagner and Daniel took advantage of the area's rich clay deposits. The Wagner brick yard is depicted above. The area was also thick with hardwood trees. That timber spurred local construction, was sold as cord wood to the Michigan Central Railroad, and supplied material for barrel factories (right). Following the closing of the Detroit Arsenal in Dearborn, the armory building was converted into textile maker Arna Mills (upper right), which produced workman's clothes and artificial buffalo robes.





2012 Calendar and Guide to Dearborn Services



Following the War of 1812, the U.S. Arsenal in Detroit was deemed vulnerable to attack, so a new federal arsenal was conceived for Dearbornville. Work began in 1833 and was overseen by Col. Joshua Howard. With the main gate at Michigan and Monroe (above), the arsenal featured 11 buildings in a walled compound, and a powder magazine placed 940 feet to the east for safety. Among the buildings were the Commandant's Quarters (right); saddler, blacksmith, and carpenter shops (upper right); surgeon's quarters; barracks, armory, and a sutler's shop, which sold supplies. The arsenal closed in 1875; four of the original buildings remain.



# Dearborn MILESTONES

2012 Calendar and Guide to Dearborn Services



In 1941, Boy Scout leaders proposed the concept of a City-owned camp to then-mayoral candidate Orville Hubbard. The idea had to wait until after World War II, but, in October 1947, city officials had found a 240-acre site in Milford for sale for \$40,000 (\$167 per acre!) Girl Scouts from Troop 346 pitched their tents and were the first to stay at Camp Dearborn in May, 1948. For 64 years, Dearborn residents have enjoyed the beaches, fishing, Tent Village, Youth Camps, golf course and more at this unique recreational facility.





Henry Ford's industrial interests extended well beyond building cars. As early as 1905 he began to experiment with the development of tractors in an effort to make farming more efficient. This equipment was tested on the Black Farm in west Dearborn (above). Ford purchased farms all over the region and improved many of them to state-of-the-art facilities. Produce from the farms was shipped to the Ford Grain Elevator, built in 1917 near Michigan Avenue and Elm (upper right). Ford also promoted roadside stands to sell fresh fruits and vegetables (right).

Born and raised in the center of the city, Henry Ford established his aviation and agricultural interests on the west end and his automobile manufacturing empire on the east end. Ford revolutionized the auto industry with the creation of the moving assembly line (upper right). In 1917 construction began on the Ford Rouge Plant (above), emphasizing the ability to process raw materials into finished components. Its first products were Eagle Boats for the Navy and the Fordson Tractor. Production of the Model A began in 1927. The Ford Rotunda (right) showcased Ford's innovations and became one of the country's most popular tourist attractions.

8 a.m. to 4 p.m. every trash day April-November

## When are Public Service Days?

Public Service Days occur on every trash day in your neighborhood during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November.

## What does the City do on Public Service Days?

Public Service Days allow the City to provide services like trash pick-up, street sweeping, tree trimming, sewer maintenance and loose leaf collection in a safe, effective manner.

## What are my responsibilities on Public Service Days?

You must keep your parked vehicles off the street from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on your neighborhood's Public Service Days.

You could be ticketed if you park on the street during Public Service Days in your neighborhood. Your vehicle may also be subjected to towing.

You also must keep your trash carts, yard waste containers and recycling carts off the street.

In addition, it is your responsibility not to park on the street in other City neighborhoods during their Public Service Days.

## How do I know what Public Service Day section I live in?

Public Service Days sections are the same as your neighborhood's trash pickup sections. See the map at right.



# Snow **REMOVAL**

## Move Parked Vehicles When Plows Are Out

Snow plowing is more effective and is safer when parked vehicles are off the roads. So you should remove your parked vehicles each time a heavy snowfall is predicted.

If the City declares a snow emergency, then you **MUST** remove your parked vehicles from the street or you could be ticketed and your vehicles could be towed. Police do not issue warnings.

In general, a snow emergency will be declared when it is predicted that snowfall will exceed 3 inches or more over a short period, and other weather conditions are unfavorable.

When snow plowing is needed, City ordinance allows vehicles in a driveway to be parked across the sidewalk without penalty.

## Snow Emergency Alerts

When a snow emergency is declared, the City contacts TV and radio stations.

Snow emergencies are also posted on the City's website, [www.cityofdearborn.org](http://www.cityofdearborn.org) and on CDTV, which is cable channel 12 on Comcast, cable channel 10 on WOW, and in 2012, channel 99 on ATT.

# Dearborn **Historical Museum**

*We hope you enjoy this year-long exploration of our history!*



This 2012 City of Dearborn Calendar and Guide to City Services was organized by the Department of Public Information and made possible through the efforts of the Dearborn Historical Museum.

Settled in 1786 and known as the home town of Henry Ford, Dearborn is a city rich in history! Your Dearborn Historical Museum (DHM) has been fulfilling its mission to "preserve, present and promote" this amazing history since 1928. The DHM features three historic structures in west Dearborn: the Commandant's Quarters, 21950 Michigan Ave., built in 1833; the McFadden-Ross House, originally the 1839 Powder Magazine at the Detroit Arsenal in Dearbornville; and the 1831 Richard Gardner House. These structures are among the few remaining examples of Dearborn's early built history and represent the roots of our community.

The DHM also features the Floyd and Mary Haight Archives, inside the McFadden-Ross House, 915 Brady. The Archives is a gold mine for those interested in local history and genealogical research. This calendar is illustrated with just

a sample of the thousands of photos on file in the Archives. The DHM also hosts a variety of programs and events, such as the monthly lecture series, school program, Victorian Tea, and Fall into Dearborn.

In addition, the DHM is the home of the Museum Guild of Dearborn. Established in 1957, the Guild is a 501c3 non-profit organization comprising more than 25 social and service groups, focused on a variety of special interests. The member organizations contribute both their time and financial support to the museum. All of these groups are open to the public and welcome your involvement. Call 313-565-3000.

# Rules for TRASH, RECYCLING and YARD WASTE

## Trash Collection (Use 96-gallon or 64-gallon City-issued gray cart)

- Trash carts must be set out on the easement, not in the street, after 5 p.m. the night before collection day or by 7 a.m. on trash collection day.
- Leave 3 feet between your trash cart and your recycling cart with the cart handles facing your house. Make sure your carts are not blocked by parked cars, fire hydrants, trees or utility poles. A truck with an automated arm will then be able to safely and efficiently collect your trash from the curb.
- Trash must be bagged and placed inside the gray carts.
- On occasion, you may place additional items in appropriate containers or plastic bags for pickup. Do not put garbage bags on top of the gray cart. If your household regularly generates more trash than fits in the cart, you may be asked to lease an additional cart for a one-time cost. There is no fee for weekly pickup of an additional gray cart.
- Do not overload the cart. Keep the lids of your carts closed.
- Do not put these items in your cart (partial list): paint, solvents, glue, car batteries, automotive parts, tires, acids, anti-freeze, gasoline, gas cans, transmission fluid, disposable LP gas tanks, chemicals, oil, hot ashes, hazardous waste, pesticides, medical waste, cement, rocks, bricks, poisons, large amounts of remodeling or demolition materials.
- Remove your empty carts from the curb by midnight at the end of your trash day. Store them inside or behind your garage, or behind your house. Try to keep them out of sight from the front sidewalk and away from your neighbors' houses.

## Bulk Items

Place your bulk items for disposal at the curb on your trash pickup day. A separate truck will pick up your bulk items by the end of your trash day. Acceptable bulk items include:

- Construction materials. Must be bagged or bundled and weigh 35 pounds or less. Limit 5 a week or 20 a year.
- Household furniture. Large move-outs do not qualify.
- Household appliances. Doors must be off refrigerators.
- Carpet/padding. Tied in 4 foot rolls. No more than 35 pounds each. Limit 6 rooms a year.
- Windows. Up to 4 x 6 feet. Limit 5 a week or 20 a year.

## Exceptions

Special pickup charges of a minimum of \$50 apply to:

- Large move-outs.
- Excessive construction materials. Private contractors are responsible for hauling away their own debris. Roll off Dumpsters may be required, at the homeowner's expense.
- Improperly bundled trash, yard waste and construction material.
- Dirt, sod, sand, concrete and bricks.
- Firewood, logs and stumps.
- Bathtubs, sinks, laundry tubs and toilets.
- Any automotive parts.

## Disposal at the Department of Public Works Yard

2951 Greenfield

The DPW Yard is open 8 a.m.-1 p.m. the third Saturday of each month for disposal of items not picked up at the curb. Residents are responsible for unloading their own vehicles.

Items accepted at the DPW yard are: furniture and other non-hazardous household materials from large move-outs, dirt, sod, sand, concrete and bricks, firewood, logs and stumps, bathtubs, laundry tubs, sinks and toilets.

A partial list of materials not accepted at the DPW yard includes: fuel, tires, ammunition or refrigerators, microwaves or other appliances.

Remember, hazardous materials are not acceptable for disposal either at the curbside or at the DPW Yard. Call DPW at 943-2085.

## Curbside Yard Waste/Brush Disposal

The expanded curbside yard waste program runs from March 12 – December 14 (weather permitting).

- Yard waste includes grass clippings, weeds, leaves, shrub and brush trimmings. Remove dirt from roots. Do not mix fruits, vegetables or animal droppings with your yard waste.
- Place grass, leaves, weeds and garden waste into yard waste paper bags or in your own 20 – 32 gallon container. Containers must be clearly marked with a yard waste sticker. Free yard waste stickers are available at all Dearborn libraries, the Public Works Yard and the Mayor's Office.
- Do not use plastic bags or cardboard boxes for yard waste.
- Dirt and sod are not acceptable as yard waste.
- Brush must be less than 3 inches in diameter, be 4 feet or less in length, tied with heavy cord or rope and weigh no more than 35 pounds. Remove root balls from shrubs and bundle same as brush.

Unbundled or improperly bundled brush requires a special pickup. Call 943-2085.

## Recycling Collection takes place every other week

Curbside recycling is mandatory in Dearborn. The lid of your green recycling cart is stamped on the outside with either an "A" or "B." Every household is on an "A" or "B" week schedule. Recycling is every other week, according to your "A" or "B" week schedule. The schedule is found below, and in

every month of this City of Dearborn calendar. Put your green recycling cart at the curb on your trash day only during your designated recycling week.

Place all acceptable clean recyclable materials loose in the green cart. Keep recycling cart lids closed.

## Acceptable materials for your green recycle cart include:

- Cardboard and paper bags (flatten cardboard and cut into pieces).
- Junk mail (envelopes, flyers, brochures, postcards, etc.).
- Paperboard (no wax coated paperboard).
- Newspaper (remove bags and rubber bands).
- Magazines, catalogs, phone books, office paper.
- Steel, tin and aluminum cans.
- Kitchen cookware (metal pots, pans, tin & utensils)
- Plastic jugs/bottles (No. 1 and 2).
- Household plastic (No. 3 through 7).
- Plastic bags.
- Glass.

Do not put the following into your recycling cart: wax coated paper milk or juice cartons, Styrofoam containers/packing, garbage, compost, food waste, electrical cords or tires.

## Household Hazardous Waste

The City of Dearborn has not scheduled a Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off Day in 2012. However, the Wayne County Department of Environment will host several drop off days. For information, call (734) 326-3936.

NEVER set hazardous material at the curb. Hazardous materials include: paint, floor care items, furniture polish, bathroom cleaners, antifreeze, motor oil, lawn and garden chemicals, pesticides, poisons, batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, mercury-containing thermometers, thermostats, cell phones, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and pharmaceutical waste.

## Trash Holidays in 2012

After the following 2012 holidays, trash pickup will be delayed one day for the remainder of the week: Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.




