The Dearborn Administrative Center (DAC) is located on the western edge of the City's municipal complex, which includes the Ford Community & Performing Arts Center, the Police Station and 19th District Court, the Henry Ford Centennial Library, and an athletic field.

Inside the DAC's main entrance is a comprehensive service counter that makes it easy for residents to obtain a birth certificate, register to vote, apply for a building permit or certificate of occupancy, pay taxes and water bills, or file a Homestead Property Tax Credit, among other services. Located within the DAC are the Mayor's Office, City Council, and City Clerk, as well as the City Council Chambers where public meetings are held.

The DAC also is home to the following City departments or divisions: City Assessor, Economic & Community Development, Engineering, Finance, Housing, Human Resources, Law & City Plan, Management Information Systems, Neighborhood Services, Public Information and CDTV, Purchasing, Residential Services and Treasurer's Office.

The City of Dearborn's consolidated budget is **\$226,460,793** and includes the general fund, which is made up in large part of property taxes and pays for the majority of the services delivered to you every day; plus federal and state grants for community improvements, operation of five senior citizen apartment buildings; state-shared taxes for highway repair and resurfacing; and water-sewer fees collected and paid to the City of Detroit.

City Services: 36 cents of your tax dollar

The City of Dearborn uses property tax dollars to provide high quality and comprehensive services to residents and businesses. Those City services are offered using just 36 cents of every dollar the City collects in property taxes. (The federally-mandated combined sewer overflow (CSO) debt millage equates to 6.9 cents of every dollar and is outlined separately here.) The other 57.1 cents of every tax dollar the City collects in property taxes is directed to other public agencies, like Wayne County and the public schools. Although the City is the collecting agent, it has no authority over how the 57.1 cents is used by other public agencies.



CITY BEAUTIFUL COMMISSION

The City encourages property owners to take pride in the upkeep of their homes and yards. Well-tended lawns and gardens, and well-maintained houses, add to the appeal of Dearborn neighborhoods and preserve property values. The City Beautiful Commission presents Residential Standard of Excellence Awards to owners of homes reflecting exceptional care, like these three houses shown here.



Grass and landscaping rules

- City ordinance requires property owners and residents to keep grass and weeds cut to six inches or less year-around. This includes all fence and property lines.
- Weed trees, saplings, and other noxious vegetation that were not intentionally planted are prohibited from fence and property lines.
- Trees, bushes and landscaping must be trimmed and maintained to prevent obstruction and provide safe passage to pedestrian and vehicular traffic.
- Compost must be properly maintained and stored at least 18 inches above the ground. Do not place food or food waste in compost.
- Landscaping, hardscape elements and outdoor furniture shall not obstruct the use of adjacent properties, including driveways or other means of access.
- Front yard gardens used for growing vegetables, fruits, berries, or any other edible produce are prohibited.

Keep sidewalks clear

- Public sidewalks and rights-of-way shall be maintained to be free of leaves, snow, ice and obstructions at all times.

Prohibited outdoor storage

The storage or accumulation of junk, goods and materials is prohibited. "Junk" includes, but is not limited to:

- Motor vehicle and machinery parts
- Appliances stored outside
- Remnants of wood, metal, or other castoff material
- Interior furniture stored outside
- Trash, debris, or refuse of any kind, other than any refuse stored according to City ordinances

Litter is not allowed

Accumulation of trash, rubbish, litter, yard waste including leaves and/or debris is prohibited.



Report graffiti

Report any graffiti on public or private property to the Neighborhood Services/Sanitation Division at 943-2433.



Building permits

- Check with the Residential Services Department at 943-2154 to see if your home construction project requires a building permit.
- Permits and inspections ensure that safety is maintained and building codes are followed.
- Construction work done properly preserves neighborhood standards.

Report construction work being done without a permit

- Building permits should be posted in a window or visible site on the home during construction.
- If you believe someone is engaging in a construction project without a permit, call 943-2161 during business hours, or 943-3030 during evenings and weekends to report the activity.

Prohibited Vehicle Parking and Storage



Recreational vehicles, trailers, towable vehicles and commercial vehicles cannot be stored in residential districts.



The storage of vehicles in an inoperable condition is prohibited. Vehicles deemed inoperable include any vehicle that cannot be legally operated on a public roadway.



Vehicles cannot be parked on lawns or other unpaved areas. Vehicles cannot be parked across public sidewalks or rights-of-way.

Rules For Trash, Recycling & Yard Waste

Please review the rules below to successfully take advantage of the City's comprehensive curbside collection of trash, recycling and yard waste.

Rules for the Trash Cart (Must use city-issued gray cart)

- **Trash must be bagged and placed inside of gray carts. Trash cannot be loose inside the carts. Trash in cardboard boxes will not be picked up.**
- **Any bagged trash (maximum of 4 bags) placed outside of the gray cart will be reloaded into your cart. If this happens frequently, City ordinance requires homeowners/occupants to lease an additional trash cart at cost.**
- **Households are required to call 943-2433 and lease an additional cart for a one-time fee of \$55 if they generate additional trash.**
- Do not overfill the cart or pack trash in too tightly. Always keep lid closed.
- Do not put garbage bags on top of the cart.
- Damage to carts by improper use will result in the property being billed for repair and/or replacement.
- If your cart is stolen, please call 943-2433 to lease an additional cart for a one-time fee of \$55.
- Seasonal décor such as hay/straw bales, pumpkins, squash, gourds, corn stalks, and other organics should be bagged and placed inside your trash cart.
- Do not put hot items such as charcoal/coals/ash in your cart.
- Other items not allowed in the trash carts include, but are not limited to: explosives/fireworks, radioactive materials, animal remains, paint, solvents, glue, car batteries, automotive parts, tires, acids, antifreeze, gasoline, gas cans, motor vehicle fluids, liquid propane gas tanks, chemicals of all kinds, cooking oils, household hazardous waste, pesticides, medical waste, cement, sand, rocks, bricks, soil, poisons, asbestos, shellac, tar, tree stumps, large amounts of remodeling or demolition materials.
- Households putting prohibited items in carts may be fined.

Rules for Collection Day

Place carts on the easement in front of your home, between the sidewalk and the curb, spaced three feet apart after 5 p.m. the night before or by 7 a.m. on your trash collection day. **City contractors are not obligated to return if carts are not out for service by 7 a.m. on your trash day.**

- The handles of your carts should face the house.
- Never put your carts, yard waste, or bulk items in the street.
- Do not place your carts or other items for service where they'll be blocked by anything including parked cars, trees, utility poles, or fire hydrants.
- Remove carts from the curb by midnight at the end of your trash day. Failure to remove carts in a timely manner may result in fines and/or tickets.
- Store your carts out of sight away from neighboring houses.

Holiday Collection Schedule

In 2015, there will be no trash collection on the following holidays, and the rest of that week's trash, recycling, yard waste, and bulk collection will be one day later than usual.

**New Year's Day • Memorial Day • Labor Day
Thanksgiving Day • Christmas Day**

Rules for Special Pickups

Excessive trash, recycling, yard waste, or bulk items require a special pickup. Call 943-2433 to schedule a special pickup. A minimum charge of \$55 will apply.

- Extraordinarily large move-outs, excessive construction debris, or other items may not be eligible for City special pickups. Roll-off dumpsters may be required at the homeowner's expense.
- Private contractors are responsible for hauling away their own debris.

Free Monthly Disposal Day at the DPW Yard

- **The DPW Yard, 2951 Greenfield, is open 8am-1pm the third Saturday of each month.**
- You must be able to move the objects from your vehicle to disposal site.
- A partial list of prohibited items includes: any liquids, tires, appliances (collected curbside), and all hazardous materials. Please call 943-2433.

Household Hazardous Waste Disposal

Wayne County will host several household hazardous waste drop off days in 2015 in area communities. Call (734) 326-3936. **Never place hazardous material in your cart or at the curb.**

Rules for the Recycling Cart (Must use city-issued green cart)

- **Curbside recycling is mandatory in Dearborn. Recycling pickup is every other week.**
- The lid of your green recycling cart is stamped on the outside with either an "A" or "B". Recycling is every other week, according to your "A" or "B" week schedule.
- Items that can be recycled are: cardboard (see note); paper bags; junk mail; paperboard; newspaper; magazines; phone books; office paper; cans made of steel, tin and aluminum; kitchen cookware; household plastics (No.1 - 7); plastic bags; and glass jars.
- **Do not put Styrofoam, garbage, compost, food, animal waste, electrical cords, tires, or wax-coated paper milk or juice cartons in your recycling cart. Households putting prohibited items in their cart may be ticketed and/or fined.**

Special information about cardboard containers

Cardboard boxes must be broken down and placed in your recycling cart. If broken down boxes still will not fit in your recycle cart, they must be bundled or tied in pieces to be reloaded into the cart. If this happens regularly, you may be required to lease an additional recycle cart.

Rules for Curbside Yard Waste Disposal (Must use yard waste paper bags or 20-32 gallon containers clearly marked with a yard waste sticker)

- **The curbside yard waste program runs from March 16 - December 11, 2015 (weather permitting).**
- Yard waste includes grass clippings, leaves, and shrub/brush trimmings.
- Place yard waste into yard waste paper bags or in your own 20-32 gallon container. Containers must be clearly marked with a yard waste sticker. Free yard waste stickers are available at all Dearborn libraries, the Public Works Yard and the Dearborn Administrative Center.
- **Households are limited to a combined total of 20 paper bags, yard waste containers, or bundles of brush per week.** Households with more than 20 yard waste items should call 943-2433 for a special pickup. Fees apply.
- Do not mix fruits, vegetables, trash, or animal droppings with yard waste. Households that put prohibited items in their yard waste containers may be ticketed and/or fined.
- **Yard waste bags and containers must weigh less than 35 pounds or they will not be collected.**
- Do not use plastic bags or cardboard boxes for yard waste.
- Yard waste (limbs, brush, debris) must be cut into 4 foot lengths and bundled using biodegradable material and must weigh less than 35 pounds.
- Private contractors are responsible for hauling away their own debris.
- Yard waste should never be blown or swept into the street.
- Unbundled or improperly bundled brush requires a special pickup. Fees apply.

Rules for Bulk Items

Place bulk/oversize items at the curb before 7 a.m. on your trash pickup day. A separate truck will pick these items up by the end of your trash day.

- **Households are limited to 5 bulk items/week, maximum of 20/year. Acceptable items include:**
 - Household furniture of a manageable size.
 - Residential household appliances. Doors must be off refrigerators and freezers.
- **Carpet/Padding**
 - Carpet and padding must be cut and tied/taped in 4 foot rolls and weigh no more than 35 pounds each.
 - Households are limited to 10 rolls per week; a maximum of 30 rolls per year.
- Large tube televisions, pieces of furniture and bulk items that cannot be lifted and contained within the bulk truck bucket will not be collected.
- Excessive quantities and large/heavy bulk items will require a special pickup fee. Please call 943-2433 for more details.

Wrong



Do not overfill your carts. If this happens regularly, you will be asked to lease an additional cart for a one-time fee.

Carts should not be placed in the street.

Right



Carts should be placed three feet away from each other, with handles facing the house, and placed on the easement. **Do not put them in the street.** Avoid obstacles. Lids should be closed.

Public Service Days

Keep parked vehicles off the streets 8 am-4 pm every trash day April – November

When are Public Service Days?

Public Service Days occur on every trash day in your neighborhood beginning in April and lasting through November. On your trash day during those months, you must keep your parked vehicles off your neighborhood streets from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

What does the City do on Public Service Days?

Public Service Days allow the City to provide services like trash pick up, street sweeping, tree trimming, sewer maintenance and loose leaf collection in a safe, effective manner.


What are my responsibilities on Public Service Days?

- You must keep your parked vehicles off the street from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on your neighborhood's Public Service Days, even if your trash has already been picked up.
- You could be ticketed if you park on the street during Public Service Days in your neighborhood. Your vehicle may also be subjected to towing.
- You also must keep your trash cans, yard waste containers and recycling carts off the street during Public Service Days, and throughout the year.

In addition, it is your responsibility not to park on the street in other City neighborhoods during their Public Service Days.

Snow Removal

Move Parked Vehicles Off The Street When Plows Are Out

Snow plowing is more effective and safer when parked vehicles are off the roads. So you should remove your parked vehicles off the street each time a heavy snowfall is predicted. If the City declares a snow emergency, then you MUST remove your parked vehicles from the street or you could be ticketed and your vehicles could be towed. Police do not issue warnings.

In general, a snow emergency will be declared when it is predicted that snowfall will exceed 3 inches or more over a short period and other weather conditions are unfavorable.

Snow Emergency Alerts

When a snow emergency is declared, find out via: Snow Emergency Hotline: 943-2444, the City's emergency warning sirens, TV and radio news reports, www.cityofdearborn.org, Nixle alerts (sign up at Nixle.com), Facebook (cityofdearborn), Twitter (cityofdearborn) and CDTV.
