The Dearborn Administrative Center (DAC) is located on the western edge of the City's municipal complex, which includes the Ford Community & Performing Arts Center, the Police Station and 19th District Court, the Henry Ford Centennial Library, and an athletic field.

Inside the DAC's main entrance is a comprehensive service counter that makes it easy for residents to obtain a birth certificate, register to vote, apply for a building permit or certificate of occupancy, pay taxes and water bills, or file a Homestead Property Tax Credit, among other services. Located within the DAC are the Mayor's Office, City Council, and City Clerk, as well as the City Council Chambers where public meetings are held.

The DAC also is home to the following City departments or divisions: City Assessor, Economic & Community Development, Engineering, Finance, Housing, Human Resources, Law & City Plan, Management Information Systems, Neighborhood Services, Public Information and CDTV, Purchasing, Residential Services and Treasurer's Office.

# City Budget

The City of Dearborn's consolidated budget is \$224,675,463 and includes the general fund, which is made up in large part of property taxes and pays for the majority of the services delivered to you every day; plus federal and state grants for community improvements, operation of five senior citizen apartment buildings; state-shared taxes for highway repair and resurfacing; and water-sewer fees collected and paid to the City of Detroit.

## City Services: 33 cents of your tax dollar

The City of Dearborn uses property tax dollars to provide high quality and comprehensive services to residents and businesses. Those City services are offered using just 33.0 cents of every dollar the City collects in property taxes. (The federally-mandated combined sewer overflow (CSO) debt millage equates to 6.3 cents of every dollar and is outlined separately here.) The other 60.7 cents of every tax dollar the City collects in property taxes is directed to other public agencies, like Wayne County and the public schools. Although the City is the collecting agent, it has no authority over how the 60.7 cents is used by other public agencies.

# Ways to Take Pride in Caring for Houses, Lawns and Gardens in Dearborn

The City encourages property owners to take pride in the look of their homes and yards. Well-tended lawns and gardens and well-maintained houses add to the appeal of Dearborn neighborhoods. They also strengthen property values, which benefits people economically, in addition to providing a nice quality of life. Excellent examples of home owners who take pride in their property are found in the photographs on this page. To help everyone meet Dearborn's basic standards, here is a summary of some of the most important tasks.

## Grass and landscaping

- Keep grass and weeds cut to six inches or less. This includes along all fence and property lines.
- Trim trees, bushes and landscaping so that they are not in the way of people walking on the sidewalk or vehicles driving in the street.
- Gardens for vegetables and fruits must be in the back yard, not the front yard.

## Sidewalks

- Make sure your sidewalks are clear of snow and ice in the winter. In the fall, rake leaves from your sidewalks.
- Don't park your vehicles across sidewalks.

## Keep your property free of "junk"

- Don't store "junk," like broken cars, motors, appliances, used wood, or discarded furniture on your lawn or porch.
- Don't store recreational vehicles, trailers, and boats on your property.
- Don't park on lawns.

## No litter allowed

- Pick up litter on your property, even if someone else has thrown it there. Pitch in to keep our City beautiful by picking up litter in your neighborhood.

## Report graffiti

- The City addresses unsightly graffiti promptly. Call Neighborhood Services at 943-2433.

## Building permits

- Check with the Residential Services Department at 943-2154 to see if your home construction project requires a building permit.
- Permits and inspections ensure that safety is maintained and building codes are followed. Construction work done properly means neighborhood standards are preserved.
- If you believe construction work is taking place without a permit, call 943-2161 during business hours, or 943-3030 at other times.

# Information on Trash, Recycling and Yard Waste Collection

Keeping our community clean and attractive is everyone's responsibility, which is why the City of Dearborn offers convenient curbside collection services. Use this guide to take full advantage of the services.

## The Basics for Trash Collection

- Trash must be bagged and placed inside of the gray carts.
- Trash cannot be loose inside the carts.
- Trash in cardboard boxes will not be picked up.
- Do not overfill the gray cart or pack trash in too tightly.
- Always keep your cart lid closed.

## The Basics for Recycling Collection

- Recycling is mandatory.
- Always use your green cart
- Do not bag recyclable materials.
- Recycling is picked up every other week on an A or B schedule. The lid of your green recycling cart is stamped with an A or B. Check the schedule on page 29 for recycling dates.

## The Basics about Materials For Your Recycling Carts

- Cardboard (clean cardboard pizza boxes or plain cardboard. Break down and flatten all boxes)
- Paper (junk mail, newspaper, magazines, phone books, and office paper)
- Household Metal (cans made of steel, tin and aluminum, kitchen cookware)
- Household plastics (No. 1-7).
- Glass Jars

## The Basics on Collection Day

- Place carts between the sidewalk and the curb in front of your home, three feet apart, after 5 p.m. the night before or by 7 a.m. on your trash collection day.
- The handles of your carts should face the house.
- Once your trash has been collected, remove your carts from the curb by midnight at the end of your trash day.

## Extra Trash, Extra Recycling and Additional Carts

- On occasion, residents are allowed to put up to four bags of trash outside of the trash cart on collection day. -But if this happens frequently, City ordinance requires homeowners to lease an additional trash cart at a one-time cost of \$55. Call 943-2433 to obtain an additional trash cart.
- An extra recycling cart may also be required if you regularly have recyclable items, such as cardboard, outside of your cart on your trash day.

## The Basics about Cardboard

- Cardboard is recyclable, so place it in your green recycling cart.
- All cardboard must be broken down so that it fits in your recycling cart.
- On occasion, cardboard may be placed outside of your recycling cart if it is full.
  - However, cardboard must be broken down and bundled so that it can fit in your recycling cart after the cart is emptied once by the automated arm on the recycling truck.
  - The only way for the recycling truck to pick up cardboard is if it is inside the recycling cart. The city's contractor will put the bundled cardboard into the cart after the cart has been emptied once. He will use the automated arm to lift the cart a second time to empty the cardboard.
  - This is not possible if the cardboard is not bundled correctly.

## The Basics about Styrofoam

- Put Styrofoam in the gray trash cart.

## Disposing of Seasonal Decorations

- Seasonal decorations, such as hay/straw bales, pumpkins, squash, gourds, corn stalks and other organics should be bagged and placed inside your gray trash cart.

## The Basics about Yard Waste Disposal

- The curbside yard waste collection program runs from March 14-Dec. 9, 2016.
- Yard waste is grass clippings, weeds, leaves, and trimmings from bushes.
- Place yard waste in paper landscape bags or in your own 20-32 gallon container. Containers must be clearly marked with a yard waste sticker. Free yard waste stickers are available at all Dearborn libraries and the Dearborn Administrative Center.
- Yard waste bags or containers must not be heavier than 35 pounds.
- Do not use plastic bags or cardboard boxes.

## Limits on the Number of Yard Waste Bags and Containers

- Households are limited to a combined 20 yard waste paper bags, yard waste containers, or bundles of brush per week.
- Branches and trimmings from shrubs must be cut into a manageable size and bundled into a manageable weight.

## The Basics about Bulk Items

- Households are limited to 5 bulk items per week and may set out a maximum of 20 bulk items per year.
  - Acceptable bulk items include:
    - Household furniture of a manageable size.
    - Residential household appliances. Doors must be off refrigerators or freezers.
    - Carpet and padding must be cut and taped or tied into bundles in 4 foot rolls and weigh no more than 35 pounds each. Households are limited to 10 rolls per week, a maximum of 30 rolls per year.

## The Basics about Special Pick-Ups

Excessive trash, yard waste, recycling or bulk items require a special pick-up. Please call 943-2433 to schedule a special pick-up. A minimum charge of \$55 will apply.





## 2016 Holiday Collection Schedule

In 2016, there will be no trash collection on the following holidays, and the rest of that week's collection will be one day later than usual. This will occur the week of New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day and Thanksgiving.

## Public Service Days

Keep parked vehicles off the streets 8 am-4 pm every trash day April – November

### When are Public Service Days?

Public Service Days occur on trash days in your neighborhood beginning in April and lasting through November. On your Public Service Day during those months, you must keep your parked vehicles off your neighborhood streets from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

### What does the City do on Public Service Days?

Public Service Days allow the City to provide services like trash collection, street sweeping, tree trimming, sewer maintenance and loose leaf collection in a safe, effective manner.

### What are my responsibilities on Public Service Days?

- **You must keep your parked vehicles off the street from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on your neighborhood's Public Service Days, even if your trash has already been picked up.**
- **You could be ticketed if you park on the street during Public Service Days in your neighborhood. Your vehicle may also be subjected to towing.**
- **You also must keep your trash cans, yard waste containers and recycling carts off the street during Public Service Days, and throughout the year.**

In addition, it is your responsibility not to park on the street in other City neighborhoods during their Public Service Days.

## Snow Removal

### Move Parked Vehicles Off The Street When Plows Are Out

Snow plowing is more effective and safer when parked vehicles are off the roads. So you should move your parked vehicles off the street each time a heavy snowfall is predicted. If the City declares a snow emergency, then you **MUST** remove your parked vehicles from the street or you could be ticketed and your vehicles could be towed. Police do not issue warnings. In general, a snow emergency will be declared when it is predicted that snowfall will exceed 3 inches or more over a short period and other weather conditions are unfavorable.

### Pilot parking program during snow emergencies

The City once again will be offering a temporary parking option during snow emergencies on designated streets for residents in neighborhoods in southeast and northeast Dearborn. Signs have been posted on the streets available for temporary parking during snow emergencies. Visit [www.cityofdearborn.org](http://www.cityofdearborn.org) for full details or call 943-2285.






