



City Budget

The City of Dearborn's consolidated budget is \$210,123,849, including federal and state grants for community improvements, operation of six senior citizen apartment buildings, state-shared taxes for highway repair and resurfacing, and water-sewer fees collected and paid to the City of Detroit. The sources of that money and the services and programs they pay for are explained below.

City Services: 32.9 cents of your tax dollar

The City of Dearborn uses property tax dollars to provide high quality and comprehensive services to residents and businesses. Those City services are offered using just 32.9 cents of every dollar the City collects in property taxes. That means that 67.1 cents of every dollar the City collects in property taxes goes to other public agencies, like Wayne County and the public schools. Although the City is the collecting agent, it has no authority over how the 67.1 cents is used by other public agencies.







Mandatory staffing levels, continuous investment in effective technology, and relevant training reflect the City's commitment to excellent public safety services. The Fire Department has a "Best in Class" response time of under 4 minutes and all apparatus are equipped with medical response technologies. All firefighters possess Advanced Life Support certification.

- Clean lint from dryer vent each time you use it. Every year in Dearborn several houses burn when dryer lint catches on fire. Don't leave your dryer running when you are not home.
- Never leave food cooking on a stove unattended. It is the leading cause of fires.
- Never use charcoal grills indoors, inside a garage or on a balcony. Never store hot coals or a hot grill in your home or garage.
- Stay indoors and away from windows and doors during a thunderstorm, and stay off the phone.
- Stay away from downed power lines. If power lines are down, keep children and pets indoors. Don't touch a metal fence in the area of a downed power line.
- Never try to drive or walk through water in the roadway.



PUBLIC SAFETY POLICIES

FIREWORKS

- The City maintains a zero tolerance policy regarding the illegal and unsafe use of personal fireworks. To report fireworks use, call 943-2201.
- Adults violating the City's fireworks ordinances will be ticketed. Parents whose children violate the fireworks ordinance may be ticketed under the parental responsibility ordinance.
- If a fireworks makes a loud bang, leaves the ground, spins or twirls, it is illegal.
- For more information, call the Fire Marshal at 943-2838.

CELL PHONES AND DRIVING DISTRACTIONS

- Drivers stopped for a traffic violation in Dearborn face an additional \$100 ticket if they are observed using a hand-held cell phone when committing the violation.
- The ordinance does not apply to drivers using phone headsets or other hands-free devices.
- State law and City ordinance prohibit texting while driving.

PLAYING GAMES IN THE STREET

- Using portable basketball hoops, hockey goals and other recreational equipment on public streets and easements is illegal. They may be removed, without notice to the owner, and impounded. The fine for a first time offense is \$100; after that the charge is a misdemeanor. Offenders must also pay impound fees.

RECREATIONAL FIRE PITS

- Standing fire pits with a surrounding screening and a top cover are allowed in Dearborn provided the fire is constantly attended.
- If there is objectionable smoke, or if the wind direction causes the smoke to invade neighboring structures, the fire must be put out.
- Fire extinguishing mediums must be provided. These can include an appropriate fire extinguisher, a garden hose, dirt or sand.
- Approved fire pits must be more than 15 feet away from a structure.
- Wood must be clean.
- Residents are not allowed to have a fire in an open metal can or barrel.

SAFE INTERSECTIONS

- Do not park within 20 feet of a crossing area or within 30 feet of a traffic control device, to keep intersections clear so children and pedestrians are not hidden from approaching vehicles.
- You could be ticketed if you park too close.

MOPEDS AND POCKET BIKES

- If a vehicle is not or cannot be registered with the Michigan Secretary of State's Office, it may not be operated on a public street or sidewalk in Dearborn. Violators may be cited and the vehicle may be impounded.



public Service days

When are Public Service Days?

Public Service Days occur on every trash day in your neighborhood during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November.

What does the City do on Public Service Days?

Public Service Days allow the City to provide services like street sweeping, tree trimming, sewer maintenance and loose leaf collection in a safe, effective manner.

What are my responsibilities on Public Service Days?

You must keep your parked vehicles off the street from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on your neighborhood's Public Service Days.

*Keep parked vehicles off the streets
8 a.m. to 4 p.m. every trash day April-November*

You could be ticketed if you park on the street during Public Service Days in your neighborhood. Your vehicle may also be subjected to towing.


You also must keep your trash cans, yard waste containers and recycling carts off the street.

In addition, it is your responsibility not to park on the street in other City neighborhoods during their Public Service Days.

How do I know what Public Service Day section I live in?

Public Service Days sections are the same as your neighborhood's trash pickup sections. For example, if your trash pickup day is on Monday, your Public Service Day is on Monday,

Leaf collection

Preferred method to guarantee timely pickup: Bag your leaves on trash day

Every week on your trash pickup day, you can dispose of leaves with paper yard waste bags or in 20-32 gallon containers with yard waste stickers. Place containers on your easement. Leaves in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be picked up. This curbside collection method ensures that your leaves will be picked up every week.

Alternative method: Loose Leaf Collection

An alternative method for disposal is the City's loose leaf collection, which is scheduled to begin October 24, 2011 and end December 2, 2011. Weather conditions can alter this schedule.

Loose leaves that are raked into the street will be picked up in your neighborhood on your trash day during the weeks that your neighborhood does not recycle. (Every neighborhood is on an "A" or "B" week recycling schedule. For instance, if you live in an "A" week recycling section, your loose leaves will

be picked up during a "B" recycling week.) Residents are asked to rake their leaves into the street as close to their trash day as possible during their neighborhood's non-recycling week.

Loose Leaf Collection limitations

Trash sections are larger than in the past, which means that the City may not complete picking up loose leaves in your neighborhood on your trash day in one week. City crews will return on your trash day during your next non-recycling week. City crews will start the section where they left off during the last trash day in the non-recycling week in your neighborhood.

Keep your parked vehicles off the street

Remember, you must keep your parked vehicles off the street on your Trash Day/Public Service Days. If cars are parked on the street, city crews will have difficulty removing the leaves from the street.

SNOW Removal policy

Snow plowing is more effective and is safer when parked vehicles are off the roads. So you should remove your parked vehicles each time a heavy snowfall is predicted.

If the City declares a snow emergency, then you MUST remove your parked vehicles from the street or you could be ticketed and your vehicles could be towed. Police do not issue warnings.

In general, a snow emergency will be declared when it is predicted that snowfall will exceed 3 inches or more over a short period, and other weather conditions are unfavorable.

When snow plowing is needed, City ordinance allows vehicles in a driveway to be parked across the sidewalk without penalty.

Snow Emergency Alerts

When a snow emergency is declared, the City contacts TV and radio stations.

Snow emergencies are also posted on the City's website, www.cityofdearborn.org and on CDTV, which is cable channel 12 on Comcast and cable channel 10 on WOW. (AT&T cable does not carry CDTV.)

Or you can check the Snow Emergency Hotline at 943-2444.

The City also uses Twitter messages for snow emergencies. Sign up at Twitter.com to follow news from "cityofdearborn." Snow emergencies may also be delivered via text or email messages from the public safety information system known as Nixle. Sign up for alerts at Nixle.com.

You may also hear the City's emergency warning sirens when a snow emergency is declared.

Rules for Trash, Recycling and Yard Waste

Trash Collection (Use 96-gallon or 64-gallon City-issued gray cart)

- Trash carts must be set out on the easement, not in the street, after 5 p.m. the night before collection day or by 7 a.m. on trash collection day.
- Leave 3 feet between your trash cart and your recycling cart with the cart handles facing your house. Make sure your carts are not blocked by parked cars, fire hydrants, trees or utility poles. A truck with an automated arm will then be able to safely and efficiently collect your trash from the curb.
- Trash must be bagged and placed inside the gray carts.
- On occasion, you may place additional items in appropriate containers or plastic bags for pickup. Do not put garbage bags on top of the gray cart. If your household regularly generates more trash than fits in the cart, you may be asked to lease an additional cart for a one-time cost. There is no fee for weekly pickup of an additional gray cart.
- Do not overload the cart. Always keep the lids of your carts closed.
- Do not put these items in your cart (partial list): Paint, solvents, glue, car batteries, automotive parts, tires, acids, anti-freeze, gasoline, gas cans, transmission fluid, disposable LP gas tanks, chemicals, oil, hot ashes, household hazardous waste, pesticides, medical waste, cement, sand, rocks, bricks, soil, poisons, large amounts of remodeling or demolition materials.
- Remove your empty carts from the curb by midnight at the end of your trash day. Store them on your property. Ideally store them inside or behind your garage, or behind your house. Try to keep them out of sight from the front sidewalk and away from your neighbors' houses.

Bulk Items

- Place your bulk items for disposal at the curb on your trash pickup day. A separate truck will pick up your bulk items by the end of your trash day. Acceptable bulk items include:
- Construction material. Must be bagged or bundled and weigh 35 pounds or less. Limit 5 a week or 20 a year.
 - Household furniture. Large move-outs do not qualify.
 - Household appliances. Doors must be off refrigerators and freezers.
 - Carpet/padding. Tied in 4 foot rolls. No more than 35 pounds each. Limit 6 rooms a year.
 - Windows. Up to 4 x 6 feet. Limit 5 a week or 20 a year.
 - Garage doors. Up to 8 x 8 feet.

Exceptions

Special pickup charges of a minimum of \$50 will be applied to the following (partial list):

- Large move-outs.
- Excessive construction materials. Private contractors are responsible for hauling away their own debris. Roll off Dumpsters may be required, at the homeowner's expense.
- Improperly bundled trash, yard waste and construction material.
- Dirt, sod, sand, concrete and bricks.
- Firewood, logs and stumps.
- Bathtubs, sinks, laundry tubs and toilets.
- Any automotive parts.

Disposal at the Department of Public Works Yard

2951 Greenfield

The DPW Yard is open 8 a.m.-1 p.m. the third Saturday of each month for disposal of items not picked up at the curb.

Residents are responsible for unloading their own vehicles.

Items accepted at the DPW yard are: furniture and other non-hazardous household materials from large move-outs, dirt, sod, sand, concrete and bricks, firewood, logs and stumps, bathtubs, laundry tubs, sinks and toilets.

A partial list of materials not accepted at the DPW yard includes: fuel, tires, ammunition or refrigerators, microwaves or other appliances.

Remember, hazardous materials are not acceptable for disposal either at the curbside or at the DPW Yard. Call DPW at 943-2085.

Curbside Yard Waste/Brush Disposal

The expanded curbside yard waste program runs from March 14 – December 16 (weather permitting).

- Yard waste includes grass clippings, weeds, leaves, shrub and brush trimmings. Remove dirt from roots. Do not mix fruits, vegetables or animal droppings with your yard waste.
- Place grass, leaves, weeds and garden waste into yard waste paper bags or in your own 20 – 32 gallon container. Containers must be clearly marked with a yard waste sticker. Free yard waste stickers are available at all Dearborn libraries, the Public Works Yard and the Mayor's Office.
- Do not use plastic bags or cardboard boxes for yard waste.
- Dirt and sod are not acceptable as yard waste.
- Brush must be less than 3 inches in diameter, be 4 feet or less in length, tied with heavy cord or rope and weigh no more than 35 pounds. Remove root

balls from shrubs and bundle same as brush.

Unbundled or improperly bundled brush requires a special pickup. Call 943-2085.

Recycling Collection takes place every other week

Curbside recycling is mandatory in Dearborn. The lid of your green recycling cart is stamped on the outside with either an "A" or "B." Every household is on an "A" or "B" week schedule. Recycling is every other week, according to your "A" or "B" week schedule. The schedule is found on the right, and in every month of this City of Dearborn calendar. Put your green recycling cart at the curb on your trash day only during your designated recycling week.

Place all acceptable clean recyclable materials loose in the green cart. Keep recycling cart lids closed.

Acceptable materials for your green recycle cart include:

- Cardboard and paper bags (flatten cardboard and cut into pieces).
- Junk mail (envelopes, flyers, brochures, postcards, etc.).
- Paperboard (no wax coated paperboard).
- Newspaper (remove bags and rubber bands).
- Magazines, catalogs, phone books, office paper.
- Steel, tin and aluminum cans.
- Kitchen cookware (metal pots, pans, tin & utensils)
- Plastic jugs/bottles (No. 1 and 2).
- Household plastic (No. 3 through 7).
- Plastic bags.
- Glass.

Do not put the following into your recycling cart: wax coated paper milk or juice cartons, Styrofoam containers/packing, garbage, compost, food waste, electrical cords or tires.

Household Hazardous Waste

The City of Dearborn has not scheduled a Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off Day in 2011. However, the Wayne County Department of Environment will host several drop off days. For information, call (734) 326-3936.

NEVER set hazardous material at the curb. Hazardous materials include: paint, floor care items, furniture polish, bathroom cleaners, antifreeze, motor oil, lawn and garden chemicals, pesticides, poisons, batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, mercury containing thermometers, thermostats, computers, printers, TVs, cell phones, fax machines, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and pharmaceutical waste.

Trash Holidays in 2011

After the following 2011 holidays, trash pickup will be delayed one day for the remainder of the week: Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day and Thanksgiving Day.

Property Maintenance

Neighborhood Associations

Neighborhood associations bring residents together to assist with the conservation of existing neighborhoods. For information, call 943-2216.

Neighborhood Services (943-2161)

All residents have an obligation to their neighbors. Keeping Dearborn clean and safe is everybody's responsibility. To that end, Dearborn property owners and residents must maintain their houses and yards to comply with safety and appearance standards.

The Neighborhood Services Division of the Department of Public Works is responsible for the appearance of our neighborhoods by managing nuisances.

If you have a concern about the condition of a property in your neighborhood, call Neighborhood Services at 943-2161. The identity of callers remains confidential.

Notices of Violation will be issued for failure to maintain property.

Common property maintenance to perform:

- Scrape and paint homes and garages.
- Repair detached gutters, siding and roofing.
- Repair minor porch and step defects.
- Replace or repair missing or broken doors and windows.

Outside storage guidelines

It is unlawful to store items outside, such as, but not limited to:

- Inoperable vehicles and parts.
- Building materials, unless the materials are to be used for a project whereby a valid permit exists.
- Interior furniture, appliances, garden tools and lawn equipment.
- Trash of any kind, other than household trash stored according to City ordinances.

City ordinance requires that property owners keep their grass a height of 6 inches or less.

All areas of the property must be maintained, including adjoining sidewalks, easements, public right-of-ways, alleys, fence lines, rear property lines, parking areas and perimeters of buildings.

Property owners must also keep their yards and flower beds free of weeds, overgrown vegetation, litter and debris.

If violations are not corrected by the owner or occupant within the time specified on the notice, the City may perform the work and assess all cutting and/or cleanup costs, plus an administrative fee, to the property owner.

Continued failure to maintain your property may result in tickets and court action.

Pest Control (943-2099)

To prevent rodents and other pests from living on or visiting your property, take the following steps.

- Seal garbage in tightly covered containers.
- Remove animal feces from your yard every day.
- Do not leave uneaten pet food outside. Do not put food on the ground for birds and animals.
- Pick up fruit that falls from your trees daily, and pick ripe vegetables immediately.
- Keep all materials that are permitted to be stored outside, such as firewood, a minimum 18 inches off of the ground.
- Do not set out rat poison. Poison is dangerous to people and pets.
- Call the City for help at 943-2099. (All calls are kept confidential.)



Abandoned Vehicles (943-2259)

The Dearborn Police Department will tow and dispose of unwanted vehicles year round for free. Call 943-2259 to arrange for a removal date for your vehicle, or to report an abandoned vehicle.

Graffiti Abatement (943-2241)

A \$100 reward will be paid to anyone who provides

information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person spraying graffiti or committing other acts of vandalism. Call Dearborn Police at 943-2241.

Residential Services

The Residential Services Department is focused on protecting property values through the enforcement of residential building codes and minimum housing standards.

- Non-Owner Occupied (Rental) Homes
 - All non-owner occupied dwellings must be registered. Property owners may be ticketed and fined for failing to register rental properties.

- All non-owner occupied dwellings are inspected every three years so that Certificates of Occupancy are kept current.
- You can look up registered rental properties at www.cityofdearborn.org. If you suspect that there is an illegal rental property in your neighborhood, call 943-2161.
- Vacant Homes
 - Homes vacant for more than 90 days must be registered.
 - Exterior property maintenance inspections are performed at registered vacant homes on a regular basis.
 - You can look up registered vacant properties at www.cityofdearborn.org "Useful Links." If you suspect that there is an unregistered vacant home in your neighborhood, call 943-2161.
- Homes for Sale
 - It is unlawful for any person to occupy or reoccupy a dwelling until a Certificate of Occupancy has been issued.
 - Inspections must be made when homes are for sale.
 - To schedule an inspection, call 943-2120.
- Permits
 - Permits are required for many home improvement projects and must be obtained before starting work. To verify that a permit is required for your project, call 943-2154.
 - Projects are reviewed and inspected to ensure work is being performed properly and according to all applicable building and safety codes.
 - It takes 5-10 working days for the application review process to be completed.
 - You could be subject to penalty fees for failing to obtain a permit. You may also be required to dismantle and remove completed work.
 - Visit www.cityofdearborn.org or the Residential Services Department at 4500 Maple for permit applications and permit information.
- Homeowner Permit vs. Contractor Permit
 - Homeowners are cautioned not to obtain a permit on behalf of a contractor.
 - Contractors may be attempting to absolve themselves from liability and poor workmanship.
 - It is not cheaper for a homeowner to obtain a permit.

Tree Programs

- Dearborn strongly encourages the preservation of trees and the planting of new trees on residential property for a healthy environment and appealing neighborhoods.
- Homeowners can participate in a low-cost tree-planting program to beautify the easements in front of their houses. Call DPW at 943-2317 in February 2011 for more details.
- Homeowners may need a permit to remove a tree on their property and may be required to replace or relocate the tree. For details, and advice about tree-trimming and tree maintenance, call 943-2317.
