RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS BAZZY AND ABRAHAM – To table the Ordinance.
9. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS BAZZY AND BYRNES – Awarding a contract to Bryx, Inc. in the amount of \$145,000 for the Furnishing and Installation of a Fire Station Alert System.
10. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS BYRNES AND HERRICK – Awarding a contract to Global Green Service Group in the amount of \$415,800 for Henry Ford Centennial Library Asbestos Abatement; also authorizing a contingency in the amount of \$29,200 and authorizing the DPW Director or designee to execute all change orders or modifications that utilize all approved contingency and requesting immediate effect.
11. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS BAZZY AND HERRICK – Awarding a contract to Decima, LLC in the amount of \$365,700.52 for the Replacement of Emergency Generators at Hubbard Manors East and West and requesting immediate effect.
12. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS HERRICK AND ABRAHAM - Awarding a contract to Graybar Electric in the amount of \$112,496.43 for the Replacement of Lumecon LED Fixtures at the municipal campus and requesting immediate effect.
13. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS BYRNES AND HERRICK – Authorizing a cooperative contract purchase from University Moving and Storage Company, through the E & I Cooperative Contract C-6008, in the amount of \$220,260 for Moving Services for the Henry Ford Centennial Library; also authorizing the Finance Director to appropriate \$44,260 from the Library Fund balance to the Library Fund, Contractual Services account and requesting immediate effect.

14. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS HERRICK AND BYRNES – Authorizing a cooperative contract purchase from Motorola, through the State of Michigan’s MiDeal Cooperative Program, in the amount of \$504,827 for Radio Equipment for the Consolidated Dispatch Center and requesting immediate effect.
15. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS BAZZY AND HERRICK – Renewing the contract with Constellation Energy (C.R. 8-387-14 & 3-103-17) in the approximate amount of \$1,000,000 annually for the purchase of natural gas for three years and requesting immediate effect.
