SYNOPSIS - "An Ordinance to Amend the Water and Sewers Chapter (Chapter  
19) of the Code of the City of Dearborn by Amending Article 1, Entitled 'In  
General'."  
RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS HERRICK AND BYRNES – To table the  
Ordinance.
6. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBER SAREINI IN NEED OF SUPPORT –  
Denying the petitioner's request to rezone the property located at 12841  
Michigan Avenue from B-B (Community Business District) to Business C  
(General Business District) zoning classification.
7. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS HERRICK AND BYRNES – Approving  
and adopting the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Project  
Plan: also adopting the resolution for the final project plan for the SDF  
Facility and First Flush Detention Basin; also designating the City

8. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS ABRAHAM AND HERRICK – Awarding a one-year contract with up to two, one-year renewals, to Limb Walkers Tree and Snow in an amount not to exceed \$120,000 annually (\$360,000 total) for Incidental Tree Services and requesting immediate effect.
9. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS HERRICK AND O'DONNELL – Awarding a contract to Traffic & Safety Control Systems, Inc. in the amount \$51,369 for the installation of a Parking Lot Access Gate at Hubbard Manor East and requesting immediate effect.
10. RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS HERRICK AND BYRNES – Renewing the contract with Johnson Controls (C.R. 2-80-18) in the amount of \$62,705 for Mechanical Systems Inspections at Hubbard Manors East and West and requesting immediate effect.

RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS BYRNES AND HERRICK – Approving the request of John Cusick, President of Cusick Design Corporation for temporary construction access at Dearborn Hills Golf Course; also denying the request to prune trees; also authorizing the Mayor to execute a site Access Agreement on behalf of the City, subject to review and approval of Corporation Counsel and requesting immediate effect.
